

Ontario Premier lauded the economic achievement of Bangladesh led by Sheikh Hasina and assured the Consul General of his full cooperation, both in personal and official capacity. He particularly stressed the environment friendly nuclear energy reactors, economic

immigration, education and Hi-tech IT based cooperation. Premier Doug Ford mentioned that Ontario will require another 250,000 skilled jobs, where Bangladesh can be a great source of skilled manpower.



Consul General Nayem Ahmed added that the Consulate General has successfully organized the first ever 'Bangladesh-Canada Business Forum-2019' in last September and looks forward to consolidating the momentum of the Business Forum. Consul General of Bangladesh particularly urged for cooperation in ICT, shipbuilding, pharmaceuticals, waste and water management, renewable energy, veterinary medicine, tertiary medical equipment, agro-food processing as the priority areas. He requested the Premier to send a Trade Mission to Bangladesh to witness the outstanding economic development taking place under the present government and determine prospective areas of trade and investment, which the Ontario Premier has very graciously agreed to.



At the end of the meeting Consul General handed over Bangabandhu's 'Prison Diaries' and a traditional 'Nakshi Kantha' as a token of gesture to the Ontario Premier. Consuls Mansurin Choudhury and Manuar Mukarram accompanied the Consul General during the meeting.
