PRIME MINISTER SHEIKH HASINA ATTENDS COP 25 IN MADRID, SPAIN

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina attended the inaugural session of the 25th Annual Conference of Parties (COP 25) of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) on 2 December 2019 in Madrid, Spain. Foreign Minister Dr. A K Abdul Momen, MP; Environment, Forest and Climate Change Minister Md. Shahab Uddin and other high officials accompanied her. Heads of States/ Governments from 41 countries attended the conference.

After the inaugural session, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina attended the Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF) roundtable at the sidelines of COP 25. UN Secretary General António Guterres, President of Costa Rica Carlos Alvarado Quesada, President of Honduras Juan Orlando Hernandez, Prime Minister of the Netherlands Mark Rutte, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi and the Executive Secretary of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change Patricia Espinosa also attended the roundtable. Bangladesh Prime Minister apprised other leaders present at the meeting that Bangladesh, the largest delta in the world, was one of the most vulnerable countries in the world to the adverse effects of climate change. She also apprised the participants that the presence of more than 11 lakh Rohingyas in Bangladesh had caused great damage our environment, especially the to

biodiversity, forests and hills of Cox's Bazar and above all the livelihood of the local population. She mentioned that Bangladesh was the first Least Developed Country to set up a Climate Change Trust Fund and had spent US \$ 415 million on climate change with its own funds. Prime Minister called on the leaders for the speedy and full implementation of the Paris Declaration on Climate Change. She demanded the establishment of "Climate Justice". She also called on the leaders to fully implement the "Loss and Damage" policy under the Paris Agreement for countries that have no role to play in environmental pollution or climate change. Bangladesh has been elected as the next President of the CVF.

STATE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS ATTENDS 14TH ASEM FOREIGN MINISTERS' MEETING IN MADRID



State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md. Shahriar Alam, MP led the Bangladesh delegation to the 14th ASEM (Asia Europe Meeting) Foreign Ministers' Meeting in Madrid, Spain on 16 December 2019.

Bangladesh State Minister emphasized on the need of decisive global collective actions to ensure voluntary, safe, dignified and sustainable return of Rohingyas to their homeland in Myanmar. He flagged the humanitarian position taken by Bangladesh in providing shelter to the Rohingyas who have fled from their own country after state persecution. He insisted the international community to put pressure on Myanmar for ensuring accountability and justice for the atrocities committed The Chair's statement, adopted by the Foreign Ministers of the ASEM Member Countries, called for a durable solution of the Rohingya crisis and for the creation of the conditions conducive to safe, dignified, sustainable and voluntary return of the Rohingyas. It also underlined the importance of ensuring accountability in this regard.

In his intervention at the ASEM Foreign Ministers' Meeting which was inaugurated by the King of Spain, State Minister Md. Shahriar Alam, MP called upon the international community to address the issue of climate change on most immediate basis. He explained the challenges faced by Bangladesh as a climate vulnerable country, and the initiatives taken by the present government under the leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to address these enormous challenges. He highlighted the achievements of Bangladesh, particularly in the area of women empowerment and in ensuring gender parity.

On the sidelines of the ASEM FMM14, State Minister Md. Shahriar Alam, MP had bilateral meetings with the Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of Ireland; Foreign Minister of Austria; Foreign Minister of Poland; Foreign Minister of Indonesia; Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of Russian Federation; Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of Spain and Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of Czech Republic. In the bilateral meetings, he invited the Foreign Ministers of ASEM Members States to invest in Bangladesh.

FOREIGN SECRETARY PARTICIPATES IN THE FIRST GLOBAL REFUGEE FORUM

Foreign Secretary Md. Shahidul Haque led Bangladesh delegation to the First Global Refugee Forum held in Geneva from 17-18 December 2019. He underscored that the Government of Bangladesh under the leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was doing its best to take care of the Rohingyas and had spent USD 628 million from its own resources since 2017 in addition to the allocation of 6500 acres of forested land. He underlined that Myanmar must fulfill its obligation to create conducive environment for the repatriation of the forcibly displaced Rohingyas to their homeland in Myanmar.

BANGLADESH DELEGATION PARTICIPATES IN THE GAMBIA VS MYANMAR CASE AT THE ICJ



A Bangladesh Delegation of 11 members led by Foreign Secretary Md. Shahidul Haque attended the hearing of a case filed by Gambia on behalf of 57 OIC members against Myanmar in the International Court of Justice. Gambia filed the case on 11 November 2019 alleging violation of obligations under the 4th Genocide Convention. The hearing of the case started on 10 December 2019 with Gambian lawyers presenting their case to the 17 judges of the ICJ. On 11 December, Myanmar Delegation led by Aung San Suu kyi made their presentation. On 12 December, Gambian lawyers made their rebuttal to the presentations made by Myanmar Delegation. Myanmar made the final observations and arguments on the same day.

Foreign Secretary Md. Shahidul Haque had meeting with the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court Fatou Bensouda on 11 December 2019 at the ICC Headquarters in The Hague

In the sidelines of the Court attendance, Foreign Secretary met with the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court Fatou Bensouda on 11 December 2019 at the ICC Headquarters in The Hague.

The Prosecutor briefed on the 14 November 2019 Pre-Trial Chamber III's decision authorizing the commencement of an investigation into the situation in Bangladesh/Myanmar pursuant to Article 15 of the Rome Statute. The Pre-Trial Chamber III had accepted that at least on 9 October 2016, members of the Tatmadaw (the Myanmar Armed Forces), jointly with other security forces and with some of the local civilians might have committed coercive acts that could qualify as the crimes against humanity on grounds of ethnicity and/or religion against the Rohingya population.

Earlier on 10 December, Bangladesh, Saudi Arabia, UAE and Malaysia jointly organized a reception at a local hotel in The Hague in honour of Gambian Minister for Justice Abubakar Tambadou and Canada's Special Envoy to Myanmar Bob Rae. Foreign Secretray Md. Shahidul Haque, President of the International Criminal Court Judge Chile Eboe-Osuji, Director-General of the OPCW Ambassador Fernando Arias, Gambia's Legal Team, Dutch politicians government officials, and senior Ambassadors, members of diplomatic corps, representatives from The Hagueinternational organizations. based representative from the OIC Secretariat, members of international media and international civil society organizations, Rohingya representatives, among others, joined the Reception.

The speakers including Canada's Special Envoy Bob Rae highly praised Bangladesh, in particular Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, for opening the borders to host the persecuted Rohingyas and extending generous supports towards them. Governments of all the countries and international community were urged to extend all possible support to Gambia to ensure justice for the victims of genocide committed against the Rohingyas in the Rakhine State by Myanmar authorities.

SECOND BANGLADESH-PHILIPPINES FOREIGN OFFICE CONSULTATIONS (FOC) HELD IN DHAKA



Bangladesh and the Philippines had their second Foreign Office Consultations on bilateral relations on 03 December 2019 in Dhaka, Bangladesh. Masud Bin Momen, Secretary, Asia Pacific, of Ministry of Foreign Affairs led the Bangladesh side, while Meynardo Montealegre, Assistant Secretary, Asia Pacific, of the Department of the Foreign Affairs, led the Filipino delegation. The discussions took an inventory of the existing relations and charted future courses. Also, visiting Filipino delegation called on the State Minister for Foreign Affairs Md. Shahriar Alam, MP.

THE FIRST EXPERT EXCHANGE FOR NATIONAL IHL COMMITTEES IN ASIA HELD IN DHAKA

The first ever Expert Exchange for National IHL (International Humanitarian Law) Committees in Asia was held on 15 December 2019 in Dhaka with participation of representatives from 07 countries, namely, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Iran, Malaysia, Nepal, Philippines and Sri Lanka. Deputy Prime Minister of Nepal Upedra Yadav graced the inauguration along with the Head of ICRC delegation in Bangladesh. The participants exchanged views and experiences on the role of the national committees in the implementation of international humanitarian principles in their respective countries in terms of legislation, capacity building and

AMBASSADOR SHEIKH MOHAMMED BELAL ELECTED AS THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE CFC

Bangladesh's nominee Sheikh Mohammed Belal, Ambassador of Bangladesh to the Netherlands has been elected for four years as the Managing Director of the Common Fund for Commodities (CFC). CFC is an autonomous intergovernmental financial institution with 101 member States and 09 member organizations established within the framework of the United Nations. It is mandated to enhance the socio-economic development of commodity producers and contribute to the development of society as a whole through projects financed from its own resources.

The election took place on 04 December 2019 during the 31st Annual Meeting of the Governing Council of the CFC held in The Hague, where member States decided by consensus from a list of six candidates by vote.
